ADDRESSING ANTI-MUSLIM ACTION IN THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA

WHEREAS, we have been called to be peacemakers (Matthew 5:9) and we are to “pursue peace with everyone” (Hebrews 12:14); and

WHEREAS, all people are created in the image of God (Genesis 1:26) and are loved by God (John 3:16) and are rightfully loved by us as our neighbors (Leviticus 19:18; Matthew 22:36-40); and

WHEREAS, over six million Muslims in the United States and nearly one million Muslims in Canada live peacefully and contribute in positive ways to society; and

WHEREAS, the number of people in the United States who hold “unfavorable opinions” about Islam is the highest level since the 9/11 terrorist attacks, according to a Washington Post-ABC poll released in September 2010; and

WHEREAS, the protest of the proposed Muslim Community Center in New York City near the site of the 9/11 terrorist attacks – over which there are legitimate differences of opinion – was often expressed in intensely anti-Muslim terms; and

WHEREAS, acts against mosques such as graffiti, arson and property damage have occurred during the past year*; and

WHEREAS, the 2005 General Assembly Resolution 0519 “Encouraging Interfaith Engagement” states, “[W]e see interreligious relationships as one of God’s special callings in our time;” and

WHEREAS, we, as members of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada understand ourselves to be a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world and therefore are called to welcome others even as we have been welcomed by God;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, meeting in Nashville, TN, July 9-13, 2011, condemns anti-Muslim speech and activity and calls upon the Church to promote respect, civility and love toward our Muslim neighbors; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that in addition to the ongoing work being done by the church concerning Muslim-Christian relations, this General Assembly urges all expressions of the church to engage in interfaith dialogue and action so that mutual regard and understanding between Muslims and Christians will be deepened.

(SENSE-OF-THE-ASSEMBLY)

**A CALL FOR REFLECTION AND ADVOCACY ON BEHALF OF THE
DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO**

WHEREAS, the mission of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) declares its passion for justice grounded in Micah 6:8 as declared in our vision statement: “to be a faithful, growing church that demonstrates true community, deep Christian spirituality and a passion for justice.”

WHEREAS, in Matthew 25:40 Jesus teaches moral responsibility in the reign of God is strongest for those most in need, saying “just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me”; and

WHEREAS, throughout the past two centuries, for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), global presence and witness have been a gift of God's mission through the church; and

WHEREAS, our international commerce and public affairs should be governed by an obligation to ensure the common good, and to resist policies and practices that do injustice and violence to others; and

WHEREAS, Global Ministries has encouraged congregations to recognize "Congo Week," (an initiative created by Friends of the Congo) the third week in October, in their respective annual worship calendars as a week of commemoration for the millions of victims of the scramble for Congo's resources and a stand for justice in solidarity with the people of the Congo; and

WHEREAS, the Community of Disciples of Christ in Congo (CDCC), in what today is the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), formerly known as Zaire, was founded in 1889 and has been related to the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the U.S. and Canada since its inception; and

WHEREAS, the 62 protestant denominations united under the ecumenical umbrella of the Church of Christ in the Congo have consistently decried the brutal and unmitigated exploitation of the Congo's immense mineral resources; and

WHEREAS, since the advent of Congolese independence on June 30, 1960, the continued greed of global corporations for precious and strategic raw materials from the Congo and failure of the international community to respond to the documented human rights abuses of Congolese victims has contributed to the failure of the Congo state;ⁱ and

WHEREAS, the series of invasions of the Congo by proxy states Rwanda and Uganda that commenced in 1996 have facilitated unfettered access to Congolese natural resources by international corporations and their collaborators in the Congo; have not only undermined democratic advancements, but have also cost

the lives of an estimated 6,000,000 Congolese; have subjected up to a half million Congolese women and girls to rape, including sexual mutilation by multiple armies from Congo, Rwanda, Uganda, and Burundi; and have increased dramatically the incidence for HIV/AIDS among women and girls, thus creating a health time bomb with dire consequences for the Congo; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 45,000 Congolese reportedly perish monthly in Eastern Congo as a direct or indirect result of the militarization of mines by elite networks of militia supported by business interests in the Congo, Rwanda, Uganda, and the industrialized world, at the detriment of Congolese socio-economic development and liberation; and

WHEREAS, these criminal behaviors are orchestrated and maintained by those seeking to profit from unfettered access to Congolese strategic natural resources (notably coltan, cobalt, tungsten, cassiterite, in addition to diamonds, gold, copper, uranium, oil, timber), in order to benefit mostly private wealth in industrialized nations, yet subjugating the Congolese people, despite the wealth of their natural resources, to poverty, suffering, slave labor, and human trafficking;ⁱⁱ and

WHEREAS, the response of the international community, including the United Nations, has demonstrated a double standard in the application of international justice because of financial greed and disregard for the value of Congolese people;ⁱⁱⁱ and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), meeting in Nashville, TN July 9-13, 2011 encourages all expressions of the church to pray, reflect, educate and advocate on behalf of sisters and brothers in the Democratic Republic of the Congo; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that our church encourage the development of legislation such as the Conflict Minerals Law 2010¹ approved by the U.S. Congress and the Trade in Conflict Minerals Act introduced to the Canadian Parliament in 2010 requiring manufacturers to trace the source of minerals used in the production of consumer electronics for the purpose of developing a conflict-free mineral supply chain and more ethical mining practices, most particularly in the Democratic Republic of Congo; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that individuals and ministries of the church choose products that are labeled "DRC conflict free" when purchasing electronic products, once such labeling begins²; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Global Ministries continue to identify resources for all expressions of the church on the matter of the exploitation of people in the extraction of the mineral wealth of the Congo; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that all expressions of the church work with Global Ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and the United Church of Christ to carry out advocacy and education across the globe for the Congo.

(OPERATIONAL BUSINESS ITEM)**

**CELEBRATE AND REAFFIRM OUR COMMITMENT TO THE VISION OF
PLANTING NEW MISSION**

WHEREAS, the Biblical witness of scripture calls us towards “making disciples” in the Great Commission, the Great Commandment, and in the practice of the early church as it spread throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, the historical record of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) demonstrates a practice of spreading the gospel through the formation and adoption of new congregations since our very inception; and

WHEREAS, our formative documents within our church demonstrate a long-term commitment to evangelism and acceptance of the mantle of “...our mission of witness and service to all people”¹; and

WHEREAS, our church has adopted a vision of being a “faithful, growing church, that demonstrates true community, deep Christian Spirituality and a passion for Justice” (Micah 6:8)²; and

WHEREAS, we have adopted our Mission “To be and to share the Good News of Jesus Christ, witnessing, loving and serving from our doorsteps “to the ends of the earth” (Acts 1:8)³; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly has adopted the 2020 vision of establishing 1,000 new congregations by the year 2020; and

WHEREAS, we have repeatedly reaffirmed our commitment towards establishing new Disciples congregations in every General Assembly throughout our history; and

WHEREAS, Disciples celebrate the planting of more than 700 new and affiliating congregations since 2001 with more than 78 percent of these congregations still in formation; and

WHEREAS, Disciples new congregations represent tremendous growth in the racial/ethnic diversity of our church, allowing Disciples to look more reflective of the face of America; and

WHEREAS, Disciples have depended on the service and commitment of more than 700 new church pastors who have sacrificed personally in the establishment of these new congregations with little financial backing from denominational sources; and

WHEREAS, the vitality and sustainability of new mission communities depend on the commitment, passion and sacrifice of highly skilled leaders who inspire, empower and model God's mission in the world; and

WHEREAS, Disciples have supported new congregations by an average of only \$3,500 per congregation each year through our offerings and Regional support, with only half of all existing Disciple congregations supporting the Pentecost offering; and

WHEREAS, given that former sources of support have declined, including grant revenue from Lilly Endowment, as a Church we will need to seek new ways to encourage congregations to support new church efforts; and

WHEREAS, new congregations of the past 20 years represent the most growth and giving towards our common mission fund, and represent the greatest number of new additions and baptisms of all our congregations;⁴ and

WHEREAS, there are still four states in the United States and 25 metropolitan areas in the United States and Canada that do not have a Disciples presence⁵; and

WHEREAS, sixty-five percent of the U.S. population still does not live near a Disciples congregation⁶;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, meeting in Nashville, TN, July 9-13, 2011, celebrates that since 2009 the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has welcomed 88 new and affiliating congregations that are listed in this docket; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that this assembly will encourage the church to fulfill its long-term mission – not only in word, but in deed – to form more congregations with financial support, congregationally initiated projects, the recruitment and training of gifted planters and leaders, and prayerful support of robust Disciples church planting.

MORAL INJURY AND SPIRITUAL CARE IN A TIME OF WAR

Proposal for Reflection and Research:

That the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, meeting, July 9 – 13, 2011, in Nashville, Tennessee, accept “Moral Injury and Spiritual Care in a Time of War” as an item for Reflection and Research during the 2011-2013 biennium. This reflection and research process would be accountable by report to the Administrative Committee, the General Board, and the 2013 General Assembly.

This process would encourage the church to engage in reflection, prayer, and education around conscience, moral injury, and spiritual care in a time of war. According to section 2.4 of the Special Rules of Procedure for the General Assembly, the Administrative Committee would work with the submitters of this item in developing ways for members of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to:

- 1) Discern how the moral and spiritual life of individuals, families, and churches are affected by war;
- 2) Study the role of religious communities in addressing moral injury and spiritual care in a time of war, including the needs of military personnel, their families, their congregations and communities.

Background

Those who go to war and those who see them off to war and greet their return face an array of moral, spiritual, and pastoral concerns. Prayer, ritual, mutual support, and the shared search for moral and theological understanding are among the ways that those who send persons to war can stand with those who go to war and return. This item for reflection and research focuses on moral injury, spiritual care and healing in a time of war.

Instruction in moral principles and the development of moral conscience are crucial dimensions of Christian faith. The capacity and will to do what is right are matters of faith. The potential damage caused by the violation of conscience is recognized by religious traditions and civil authorities.

“Moral injury,” sometimes called “spiritual injury,” is a term that Veterans Administration (VA) mental health professionals have begun to use about an injury of war. The VA clinicians define moral injury as the devastating negative consequences of “perpetrating, failing to prevent, or bearing witness to acts that transgress deeply held moral beliefs and expectations.” Moral injury was identified as both a contributing and an aggravating factor to Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), but unlike PTSD, it involves a conscious moral dimension and is sometimes called “spiritual injury.”

Research on moral injury indicates it is a significant contributor to clinical depression, addiction, violent behavior, and suicide, though its preliminary status means moral injury remains off the official list of injuries treated by VA clinicians.ⁱ

The idea behind “moral injury,” however, is not new. Through the Bible and history we have understood that our actions and their consequences have potential to wound our souls. In difficult situations, such as war or other times of extremity, moral decision-making can be agonizing and carry life or death consequences. Moral suicide can lead to physical suicide.ⁱⁱ

For these reasons, we call for the Administrative Committee to explore ways for the whole church to engage in reflection, research, prayer and education so that we might respond to brokenness and be agents of healing in a time of war.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING

WHEREAS, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has longstanding commitments ensuring the basic human rights of all persons¹; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking, also known as “trafficking in persons,” is a global, widespread and illegal practice which violates basic human rights, including the United Nations Declaration of Universal Human Rights Article 4, and is against God’s intention for the human community found in scripture, e.g., in Isaiah 58:6 (NRSV), “Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of injustice, to undo the thongs of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?;” Hebrews 13:3 (NRSV), “Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured;” Luke 4:18 (NRSV), “The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free;” and

WHEREAS, human trafficking is the use of force, coercion, fraud or abduction to exploit the person for profit or service; and

WHEREAS, “victims of human trafficking are subjected to labor and/or sexual exploitation, which may take many forms including debt bondage, commercial sexual abuse of children, prostitution, pornography, bride trafficking, child soldiering, domestic servitude and forced labor”²; and

WHEREAS, human trafficking is the fastest-growing criminal industry in the world and is tied with arms dealing as the second largest worldwide criminal industry,³ generating approximately \$32 billion dollars annually⁴; and

WHEREAS, according to the U.S. Department of State⁵, approximately 800,000 people are trafficked across national borders, and up to 27 million adults and

children worldwide are coerced into forced labor or other service, many in their own countries; and

WHEREAS, an estimated 14,500 - 17,500⁶ persons and an estimated 800 – 1200 persons⁷ are trafficked annually into United States and into Canada respectively, often in the communities where we live, work and worship; and

WHEREAS, women and children represent the largest percentage of those being trafficked worldwide⁸; and

WHEREAS, there are 244,000⁹ children and youth in the United States estimated to be at risk of child sexual exploitation; and

WHEREAS in the United States, the Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000, (reauthorized in 2008), made human trafficking a Federal crime in the United States It was enacted to prevent human trafficking overseas, to protect victims and help them rebuild their lives in the U.S., and to prosecute traffickers of humans under Federal penalties¹⁰; and

WHEREAS, in Canada the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act of 2001 was enacted which, in part, made Human Trafficking a criminal offence.¹¹

WHEREAS, the U.S. Senate Concurrent Resolution 40,¹² passed on June 22, 2007, supported the annual observance on January 11th of Human Trafficking Awareness Day to increase awareness of this global injustice; and

WHEREAS, the National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA has called upon its member communions to study and engage in advocacy on issues of human trafficking; and

WHEREAS, Disciples Women has had human trafficking as the ministry's advocacy priority as evidenced in ministries across the United States and Canada and at the 2010 Quadrennial Assembly, and will continue this advocacy priority for the current quadrennium; and

WHEREAS, resources for education and advocacy regarding Human Trafficking are available through Disciples Women, Global Ministries, and other organizations¹³ ;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the 2011 General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, meeting July 9 – 13, 2011 in Nashville, Tennessee, declare its opposition to human trafficking; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) encourage its members, congregations and various expressions and manifestations to engage in education about the issue of trafficking in persons in our own communities and around the world, and in advocacy efforts to end this criminal and abusive practice; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that members, congregations and various expressions of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) be encouraged to advocate for the ongoing funding and strengthening of the U.S. Trafficking Victims Protection Act of 2000¹⁴ and to advocate and support the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act of 2001 in Canada.

It provides funding through 2011 and is subject to further amendment and reauthorization.

JUSTICE IN EDUCATION REFORM

WHEREAS, most of our nation's children depend on public schools for their education¹; and

WHEREAS, previous General Assemblies have affirmed the value of public education²; and

WHEREAS, many in the ecumenical community are recently and currently concerned about the performance and reform of public schools³; and

WHEREAS, there is currently much discussion by policymakers and others about achievement gaps in public schools and how to close those gaps⁴; and

WHEREAS, there is a move today among policymakers (especially federal policymakers) to deal with these achievement gaps by closing struggling schools and substituting publicly funded charter schools that are managed by private boards⁵; and

WHEREAS, this approach leaves traditional neighborhood public schools to serve the majority of students with special needs, English language learners, children who are homeless, and children who do not fit the specific profiles of many charter schools and thus will not be accepted by them⁶; and

WHEREAS, a just system of public education is our best hope for addressing the needs of *all* our children⁷; and

WHEREAS, a just system of public education addresses the resource opportunity gaps underneath achievement gaps in our public schools,⁸ as well as the issues of race, class and geographical/residential location that affect these resource opportunity gaps⁹;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church meeting in Nashville, TN, July 9 – 13, 2011, affirms that education reform must be approached in a way that deals with the justice issues of race, class, special needs, and geographical/residential location in relation to the more equitable distribution of resource opportunities; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Assembly urges all Disciples to engage actively in prayerful reflection, study, and public conversation about public education, including charter schools, through the lens of these justice concerns; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that the Assembly urges all Disciples to contact policy-makers and advocate for an approach to public education reform that is just and equitable, and that will continue to provide a quality education to all our children, regardless of race, class, special needs or geographical/residential location.

PREVENTING SEXUAL ABUSE AND MINISTERING TO ITS VICTIMS

WHEREAS, the act of the sexual abuser is illegal, sinful and inconsistent with the love of God as revealed in Jesus; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the church respond compassionately, comprehensively and effectively to victims; and

WHEREAS, we, as the body of Christ in the world, have a responsibility to minister to all those who suffer; and

WHEREAS, in order to prevent sexual abuse, we must acknowledge that some clergy and other church leaders have abused their power and authority to violate boundaries and engaged in inappropriate sexual behaviors and relationships;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that all expressions of the church – congregations, regions, and general ministries - nurture the spiritual wholeness of victims of sexual abuse and provide avenues for healing and reconciliation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Assembly acknowledges that each situation requires individualized care and response as the church seeks to walk with victims of abuse on their journey of healing; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, meeting July 9-13, 2011 at Nashville, Tennessee, calls all expressions of the church to:

- minister to all those who have suffered from sexual abuse
- stand in solidarity with all victims
- provide sexual abuse prevention education for children and adults
- adapt church space and plan transportation to reduce the privacy that can permit sexual misconduct to occur
- adopt misconduct prevention policies that provide a structure for investigation, action, and follow-up on complaints of sexual misconduct
- employ psychological testing, require criminal background checks and boundary training for candidates for the Order of Ministry
- require criminal background checks and sexual abuse prevention education for all paid and volunteer staff

SUPPORT OF CHILDREN AND YOUTH
BY OPPOSING BULLYING IN SCHOOLS, THE CHURCH AND THE COMMUNITY

WHEREAS, the Bible tells us that all people are created in God's image and are beloved children of God; and

WHEREAS, Jesus teaches that we are to love God by loving our neighbor; and

WHEREAS, the Church is called to seek justice for all people, especially to protect those who are most vulnerable; and

WHEREAS, the General Minister and President has declared a biennium goal focusing on ministry to, with, by and for children, youth and young adults; and

WHEREAS, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) has committed itself to care for children, providing a safe place for learning, growing and spiritual development including initiation of ministries such as Light a Candle for Children; and

WHEREAS, a person is bullied when he or she is exposed, repeatedly and over time, to negative actions on the part of one or more other persons, and he or she has difficulty defending himself or herself.ⁱ

WHEREAS, bullying in schools and in the community impacts all of God's children including those who participate in bullying, those who are victims of bullying and especially those who suffer such extreme emotional distress as a result of bullying that it leads to self injury, including suicide; and

WHEREAS, bullying happens because of many factors including, but not limited to, sexual orientation, immigration status, economic status, cognitive and physical ability, weight, race and culture; and

WHEREAS, social media, text messaging and other forms of digital media provide opportunities to engage in bullying outside the realm of personal contact, even allowing adults the ability to pose as children; and

WHEREAS, recently a number of children and teens have attempted or committed suicide as a result of bullying at school and in the community, including particularly among gay teens; and

WHEREAS, silence of the church in the face of bullying and of suicides brought on by bullying implies the giving of permission for such acts; and

WHEREAS, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) claims the identity of being a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, meeting in Nashville, Tennessee July 9 – 13, 2011, renew its support, love and ministry to, for, with and by all children, youth and young adults; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this General Assembly denounces bullying as sinful and harmful; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this General Assembly calls on congregations to work with local communities to address bullying and other forms of harassment, including educating children, youth, and adults about preventing, identifying and reporting bullying; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Disciples Home Missions continue to identify resources for congregations and regions on the matter of bullying; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this General Assembly calls on regional ministries to address the issue of bullying within our camp and conference programs; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED that this General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) instructs the General Minister and President to work with appropriate ministries of the church to support children and youth regardless of their sexual orientation, economic ability, immigration status, cognitive and physical abilities, weight, race or culture in order that all of God's children will experience the love of Jesus and wholeness in a fragmented world.

**AMENDING THE SPECIAL RULES OF PROCEDURE FOR THE GENERAL
ASSEMBLY**

WHEREAS, the “Special Rules of Procedure for the General Assembly”, revised 1989, Rule VI H states “Speeches on Items for Reflection and Research shall be limited to one in favor of acceptance and one opposed to acceptance, and will be limited to five minutes each”; and

WHEREAS, the “Special Rules of Procedures for the General Assembly”, revised 1989, Rules VI I states, “On Items for Reflection and Research, there will be one speech in favor of acceptance and one speech opposed, followed by the vote. (Speeches in this classification will be limited to five minutes and cannot be reduced by action of the assembly.)”; and

WHEREAS, the “Special Rules of Procedure for the General Assembly” were last revised in 2009 at the Indianapolis General Assembly and the above sentences about speeches on Items for Reflection and Research were inadvertently left out of the 2009 revision; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of, according to “Special Rules of Procedure for the General Assembly” 2.4.1, “Items for Reflection and Research introduce critical issues that require further exploration before they could be addressed in resolutions, study documents, or items dealing with church policies or operations, and those that may never lend themselves to “yes-no” votes,” so the focus of the Assembly debate on an Item of Reflection and Research should be on whether or not to accept the item for reflection and research, not on the critical issue itself; and

WHEREAS, the “Special Rules of Procedure for the General Assembly” may be amended by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the voting members of the General Assembly present and voting, as long as proposed amendments are circulated in advance as regular business items of the General Assembly;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) gathered in Nashville, TN July 9 – 13, 2011 amend its rules of procedure by inserting under the section related to Items of Reflection and Research to read: “7.1.4.2 there will be one speech in favor of acceptance and one speech opposed, followed by the vote. (Speeches in this classification will be limited to five minutes and cannot be reduced by action of the assembly.)”; and

FINALLY, BE IT RESOLVED the title 7.8 of “Special Rules of Procedures of the General Assembly” to read “The total time for debate unless otherwise noted in these rules.”

REPORT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE – UPDATE ON 2009 GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTIONS

As part of the reorganization of the General Board and of the General Board living more fully into its responsibilities, seven committees have been established to do the work of the Board; Governance, Mission Finance, Audit, Counsel and Mediation, General Ministry Covenantal Dialogue, General Minister and President's Vision Advisory and General Assembly.

The General Assembly Committee of the General Board has a two-fold responsibility. First – the General Assembly Committee replaced the former Time and Place Committee and thus will be bringing a separate business item to approve the location and date of the 2015 General Assembly.

The second responsibility is to follow up on approved or referred resolutions which contained actionable items from the previous General Assembly and report back to the current General Assembly.

Updates to the 2009 General Assembly resolutions include:

0915 Axis of Friendship

The General Assembly Committee is continuing to follow up with the submitters of the resolution to learn of what progress has been made in promoting September 12th of each year as an Axis of Friendship Day.

0916 Be a Global Mission Church

Since the 2009 General Assembly in Indianapolis:

- ❖ 18 Congregations have become recognized as Global Mission Churches, bringing our denominational total to 33
- ❖ 7 Regions have become recognized Global Mission Regions, bringing our total to 18
- ❖ Global Ministries has developed a guide for local youth groups to become recognized as Global Mission Youth Groups
